NEW NEIGHBORS FOR DAVENPORT HOUSE

The construction of the Army Family Housing project on the Rock Island Arsenal east of the Colonel Davenport House is planned to begin in early November and last more than a year. The project adds over 30 single-family homes, playground, and basketball court.

It will include road and partial parking lot closures getting to the Colonel Davenport House. There will be signs at Hillman St. and Whittemore St. informing drivers that no through-traffic is allowed and that the streets have no outlet during construction.

DAVENPORT HOUSE RECEIVES GIFT FROM AUGUSTANA

The sewing table and reference booklet gifted to the CDHF was part of an Augustana College student’s Senior Honors Project. Jordan Kirkbride Stockwell was an Art History major, Class of 2014, under the supervision of Dr. Catherine Carter Goebel, Paul A. Anderson Chair in the Arts, Augustana College Professor of Art History.




Jordan had been involved as a passionate volunteer for the Colonel Davenport House for many years. As part of her senior project, Jordan and Dr. Goebel researched together and purchased, through the Paul A. Anderson Chair, the small sewing table that Jordan’s research confirmed was appropriate for the house.

The sewing table is a period piece, dating to about 1840, contemporary with the pieces that would have filled Colonel Davenport’s home. It is made in the German Biedermeier style, which occurred alongside other important styles such as French Empire and British Regency. The table is covered in walnut veneer which was a very popular wood at the time. The small table top sits on a single pillar which is supported by three curved feet. These curves are very similar to the ones seen in the pier table and many other pieces in the Colonel Davenport House collection. The table has two small drawers which are divided into smaller sections to hold important sewing implements as this was before the time when sewing machines would be available in domestic settings. Because of the fact that a table like this one is mentioned in the Davenport family will, it is a very important piece that will add authenticity to the home and can be supported by primary documentation.

VOLUNTEERS GET FRESH LOOK AT DAVENPORT HOUSE

On Saturday, August 13 an event for CDHF volunteers and guests entitled "Fresh Look" took place at the Colonel Davenport House. About 20 people attended the event. Dr. Catherine Goebel, Professor of Art History, Augustana College, presented the CDHF with a sewing table from the mid-19th century and talked about the background of the table.



Gena Schantz, a charter member of the CDHF, provided the guests with some interesting facts about the Davenport family, the house, and the historical background of the area when the family lived there. Then Gena gave a tour of the House to the attendees followed by a question and answer session.

The two main characters that you will meet are not fictional. They actually could have crossed paths so long ago. One is buried in the Confederate Cemetery in Rock Island, and the other is buried in eastern Iowa.

"I have wanted to enter the contest in the past but never could commit to it. But this year, with my wife Amy's support, I gave it a go. She was a big help with the research and editing."
